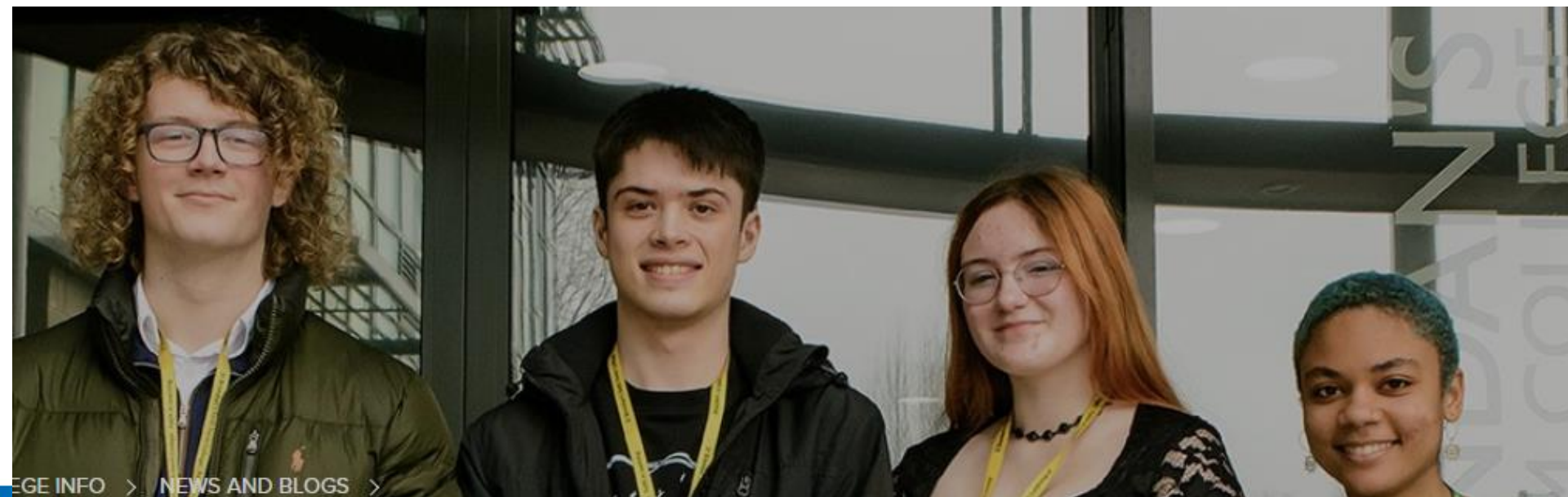

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

What is the EPQ?

An Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is an in-depth research project on any topic outside of the students A-level curriculum.

It takes the form of an experiment, extended essay, performance or an artefact.

- Students either write a 5000 word essay **or** create an artefact with a 1000 word report
- EPQ is independent, but students are supported by their Supervisor
- Students have one 'Taught Skills' session per week.
- It is graded A* to E and is the equivalent to half an A-level.
