STUDENT UNION EXECUTIVE OFFICERS



IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN PUTTING YOURSELF FORWARD. THE ROLES AVAILABLE ARE AS FOLLOWS:

PRESIDENT

The Team Leader

Overall responsibility for the Students' Union and chief liaison with the senior management of the college.

SECRETARY

The Biggest Organiser

Produces minutes and agendas whilst managing SU finances.

EQUALITY, DIVERSITY AND INTERFAITH OFFICER

The Inclusion Lead

Responsible for actively seeking the views of all students to ensure the college is meeting *all* their needs, as well as organising relevant events.

COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER

The Mouthpiece

Responsible for promoting the Student Union and its activities, across social and physical media from posters to emails.

VICE PRESIDENT

The Primary Spokesperson

Shares responsibility with the President and supports them in their role, also takes the lead when the President is absent.

STUDENT GOVERNOR

The Representative.

A member of the SU team and attends senior Governors meetings on behalf of the student body.

SPORT AND ENRICHMENT OFFICER

The Activities Enthusiast

Acts as a contact for students regarding enrichment and responsible for Sport and Student Union activities and events

SUSTAINABILITY AND STUDENT LIFE OFFICER

The Force For Change

Works to ensure that the college is being proactive in meeting the needs of the student body and students' priorities/interests relating to the environmental sustainability of the college.

- 5 key campaign points. These should be issues you'd like to tackle or things you'd like to achieve during your time in office
- Why students should vote for you

Your manifesto should be no more than 250 words.

CAMPAIGNING - MONDAY 28TH OF MARCH - FRIDAY 1ST OF APRIL

Begin your campaign drive to gain votes. This may include making campaign posters, or campaign videos and attending the hustings on the Wednesday lunchtime of this week (30th of March).

MID-MARCH

Informal interviews for Governor/President/Vice-President roles.

VOTING - 4TH, 5TH, 6TH OF APRIL

Student Union election voting will take place.

RESULTS - 7TH OF APRIL

Results will be announced.

SU HANDOVER DAY - 11TH OF MAY (TBC)
